### PROJECTS.

#### NEPAL: The Sathya Uddhyan School is ready! Total costs € 118,100.

Sathya Uddhyan started in 2010 at the initiative of Rashmi Kafle. She takes care of the children of waste processors who roamed the streets. We have known the project since 2012. Our support consists of the co-financing for rebuilding of her school after the earthquakes in 2015. In addition, we provided training to the teachers on interactive learning methods and hygiene.

Construction of the activity hall, the last part of this school, started in 2021.

The activity hall has become beautiful! An extra reinforcement and fencing behind the school, necessary because of erosion, is also ready. This year the children again received a t-shirt. A yellow one and on top of that a warm winter jacket in December. The winter jackets have also been distributed to the staff. In principle we can complete this project with this, although we will of course keep in touch. Rashmi has become a friend and the children have become our children as well.

#### NEPAL: Developed Nepal.

The volunteers of this small Nepalese NGO are a bit out of the picture. Most have now graduated and have found a job, which makes their voluntary work more difficult. For the moment we leave it at that.

### **BANGLADESH: Sun Child Sponsorship Program.**

We have been collaborating with Rights and Sight for Children [RSC] and Distressed Children International [DCI] on their project since 2010. Children of poor families in the Patuakhali District in Bangladesh are sent to school through a sponsorship program. A fixed group of donors sponsors a Sun Child through us.

In 2021 we supported 34 Sun Children, 3 of which are in the Higher Secondary School [HSS], of which Rikta has now graduated. 16 Sun Children were in secondary school and the other 15 are still in primary school. In total 26 of the Sun Children sponsored by us are girls. We have set up a special Bonus program for this.

### **BANGLADESH: Bonus Program of the Sun Child Sponsorship Program.**

This Bonus Program was set up in 2014 by Perspective 3000 to encourage the parents of girls to let their daughters continue their education after primary school. For each completed school year after primary education, they receive a small amount of money, with which they can supplement their family income. It starts when the girls have successfully completed primary school and continue studying in class 6. They will then receive Taka 5000, which is approximately equal to € 50, -. Each year that the girls continue their education, this is increased by Taka 1000 to a maximum of Taka 10,000. Class 10 is the last year of high school. After that they can study for 2 extra years, after which they can study at a college or university. The only additional condition is that they are not allowed to get married before their 18th birthday. This year the 1st girl took her final exam! We hope more will follow. Funding for this program comes from the AFAS Foundation.

We shared this idea with RSC and DCI and hope they will copy it so more Sun Children in their care can benefit.

### **BANGLADESH: Library Project.**

The library was not allowed to open due to Corona. All schools are also closed. The children received homework at home and the books are also delivered at home. That way, learning can continue.

## BANGLADESH: SUKP

SUKP stands for Samajik Unnayanee Karmo Prochesta, which means as much as: "Develop society by working well". The center was set up by Dr Amin and his wife Rina.

It is a day center for boys and girls aged 5 to 18 years with multiple disabilities (physical, mental, cerebral palsy, Down). If necessary, the children are picked up and taken home again with a simple transport rickshaw. At the center they receive lessons, manual labor, singing and dancing. Lunch is enjoyed together and the children are involved as much as possible in all activities. The aim is to teach the children a craft by the age of 18, with which they can produce something and earn a little money. The children come from families with different religious backgrounds: Muslim, Hindu, Christian, Buddhist. The staff consists of 4 female and 2 male teachers.

Dr Amin has built a physio exercise room on a piece of his own land in 2020, to which we contributed € 1000 for the roof. The Bishop Bekkers Fund also donated € 2394 in 2020 for the purchase of adapted school and teaching materials.

In 2021 they received the symbolic amount of € 3000 from Perspective 3000 to build an extra classroom. We expect news about this in the spring of 2022. Within this amount, warm blankets were also distributed to the families of the children, because it is a particularly wet and cold winter.

## BOLIVIA: La Aldea Cristo Rey has been completed.

This is a center for children whose parents are in the prison of Cochabamba, Bolivia. In 2020, we agreed to renovate their library space and convert it into a multi-functional learning, reading and playing space. The communal kitchen was also renovated.

Wilde Ganzen once again became our partner and this project has now been completed.

Generating more money than we initially needed, we decided to upgrade the small unit kitchens with new cookware as well. It has become beautiful and is now much better used.
