SATHYA UDDHYAN SCHOOL: Keep a child from the streets

The reason for the project.

In May 2015, the world was shocked by a major earthquake in Nepal. As a result, Rashmi Kafle's Sathya Uddhyan Residential School lost its home. The students slept under tables outside in the garden. Perspective 3000 then decided to take action to help these children find a new home. Since then, we have been rebuilding the school with hostel.

UPDATE

In 2025 € 4000,-.

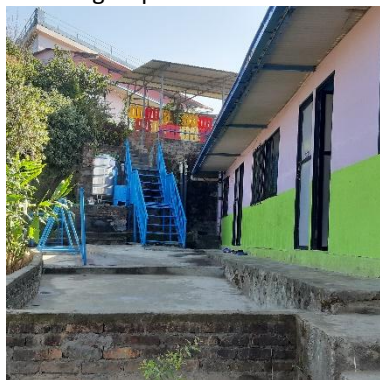
In 2024 the enduring monsoon rains caused a major damage on the terrace in front of the schools and at the north side near the vegetable garden. As the retention wall at the eastside was holding well, we decided to make a new retention wall at the westside and to enforce the north side slope. Costs € 4000, -. Medio 2025 the work was ready and the justification received and approved.

In 2022 The Sathya Uddhyan School with hostel and activity hall is ready!

The last mile! € 3860,-

In 2022 we donated € 3000.- for an extra reinforcement wall at the school buildings. The steep slopes of the terrain are vulnerable, it turns out again and again and this year there was more rain than other years. Because many new children have joined, we have given them all a warm jacket again. € 860,-

At the end of 2022 we visited the school again and officially opened the activity hall, the last part of this school. The hall was dedicated to Marijke (Mart's deceased sister), who made a major contribution to this through her fund. The activity hall has become beautiful and has a reinforced flat play roof. Both are used daily for different activities. Wild Geese has always been involved in the rebuilding of Sathya Uddhan. With the hall, the last part of this project has been realized and we can close this project. However, we will still respond to training requests.

In 2020 Activity hall for Sathya Uddhyan € 25.000,-

Rashmi's last wish for her school is a so-called activity hall. Here the children can play, read, watch TV and eat together. The parent meetings can also take place here again in the future. This has not taken place due to the construction work of recent years. We have decided that this auditorium also is a valuable part of the school. Without it, the children eat in groups outside under a canopy. Contrary to what we wrote in 2019, this hall will not cost € 10,000 but 2 1/2 times as much. Because we did not understand the difference correctly, we asked for 2 new quotes. The difference in price is in the roof, which was initially supposed to be made of corrugated iron, but which on closer inspection is now a concrete roof with a fence around it to have more play space for the children.

In 2019 Warm hats and sweaters € 500,-

In November, Mart visited Sathya Uddhyan. The aim was to find out why the application for the activity hall had turned out to be so much more expensive. In addition, together with Rashmi, he wanted to check the maintenance of the buildings. Because we are satisfied with everything, we are now also going to help her realize her activity hall.

In the meantime, it was getting colder and because that hall is not immediately there, we must have given the children warm sweaters and hats.



In 2018 The Hostel for Sathya Uddhyan € 30.600 + retaining wall € 8.000,-

In October 2017 we had raised the money for the construction of the hostel.

In November 2018 we visited Sathya Uddhyan again. Two school buildings with 7 classes have now been realized. The 7th grade serves as a library and tutoring class. Rashmi has an office. There are two hostel buildings, one for boys with a max. capacity of 24 children and one for girls, with a max capacity for 14 girls. There is also a room for Rashmi. There is also a kitchen building, realized with € 2,700 from Jhawalakhel Football Club. They had the money again from donors from the Netherlands. Finally, a large retaining wall has also been built, to prevent erosion, costs € 8,000, -.

We realized the sanitary areas with the help of Stichting Jong, with a contribution of € 5,000, -, which we initially advanced. We received this back in 2019.



In 2016 The School for Sathya Uddhyan is ready € 24,300

In November 2015 we received the funding for the construction of the school thanks to the many people who sponsored us. We went to Nepal to see how far the preparation had progressed in the meantime and to discuss everything properly. The construction turned out to be three-quarters finished.

In March 2016, the school was finished, but the children could not stay there yet. As a temporary solution, only half of the children could be there and they used one of the classrooms as a dormitory, so that they could at least get lessons started again. We gave a training interactive teaching and hygiene for the 6 teachers of the Sathya Uddhyan School. 4 teachers from 2 public primary schools in the area also joined.



In 2012 introduction to Sathya Uddhyan Residential School

We have known Rashmi Kafle since 2012. She runs a school with hostel for underprivileged children. Just 10 km outside Patan, the southeast of Kathmandu. Here she offers education and a safe place to live. The parents of the children are mostly Dalits who are plastic waste workers. They work long hours and 7 days a week. Their children did not go to school and roamed the streets with all the dangers that entailed.

Rashmi was concerned about their fate and first founded a school in the slum, where the children lived.

When the government started building sewers and high-rise apartment buildings here, most people lost their homes and spread out across the city. However, the children wanted to keep 'their' school and Rashmi found a suitable building 10km outside the city, with an affordable rent, where she could offer the children shelter in addition to schooling. The parents were happy with this solution. On long weekends and holidays the children go home. We visited this school and taught how to brush our teeth, make paper beads and hand hygiene.
